# How to Claim Native Title

### Native title rights, fences and gates

The customer sometimes lock the gates. There are sometimes good reasons why the customer would lock the gates, like:

- create a safe zone for the cattle and other animals getting out
- create a safe zone for the sheep
- customer need to lock the gates because of the rules for organic farming

It is reasonable for the customer to lock the gates if:

- the gates are used to create a safe zone for the cattle and other animals
- the gates are used to create a safe zone for the sheep
- the gates are used to create a safe zone for the organic farming

### What to do when you are standing at a locked gate

You need to check what is reasonable and what is not. The gates will have locking to the station owner and you should not damage them.

**This is reasonable**

- Think about the gate and the lock without changing it.
- You can talk to the customer to check the gate.

**This is not reasonable**

- You cannot use the gate if the lock is not on the ground.
- You cannot cut the lock on the gate.

**You have to think about these ones.**

- Can you lock the gate and the lock is not on the ground?
- You cannot cut the lock on the gate.

### What can native title holders do when the gates are always locked?

- You can try to talk to the station manager. You can ask your PIC for help. The PIC can also ask the CLC for help.
- If you can talk to the station manager and the station manager can talk to you and you can talk to the station manager.
- If the station manager does not want to talk to you, you, your PIC can ask CLC for other ways to get the gates, but talking to the station manager.

### Whoever owns the mother, owns the young ones

#### What are the rights for when there is mining and native title on a pastoral lease?

The government owns the pastoral lease. They give 3 different groups of people rights over that part of the station.

1. Mining company
2. Native title holders

Mining rights are the strongest. Pastoral rights are stronger than native title rights.

1. Mining
2. Pastoral
3. Native title

This means that most of the time, you can still go on country, go hunting or camping and use those areas. But, you cannot make trouble for the cattle business of the mine business.
